Cllr McKenzie (County) asked if anyone had any questions:

Junction of A40 with the old A40 route by the Pusedown Inn is dangerous and needs to be lighted and cats eyes placed in the road. Suggested that the Council emails her asking why the cats' eyes had been removed and not replaced during resurfacing work and canvas the support of Compton Abdale Parish Council. - Rural Broadband.** Cllr Mrs P Rigby stated that she had received no information on the progress of the project and Cllr McKenzie agreed to make enquiries.
Cllr C Hancock (District):
- Planning Application 11/04407/FUL** Erection of 10Kw rated wind turbine on 25m mast (28.6m overall height) at Cats Abbey Farm is to be considered by CDC's Planning Regulatory Committee.
- Drainage** – Cllr Hancock had inspected the stream through the Wellings with Mr R Wills and CDC Drainage Officer. Mr Wills had agreed to co-operate provided that the clearing work is carried out by CDC and Cllr Hancock agreed to ascertain if CDC has the required funding.
- 7/12** **Police Report – Sgt Martin Jones**
Number of crimes in Northleach have increased from 48 in 2011 to 52 offences in 2012 but despite these figures it has been reasonably quiet.
There has been some damage to vehicles but no one has yet come forward with information.
Community Safety meetings now take place in Northleach combining north and south Cotswolds but the group has reduced funding.
Staffing - Lost approx. 120 Officers in Gloucestershire due to funding cuts and have not recruited for over 2 years. Experienced staff are retiring as the maximum length of service is 30 years. All Officers in North Cotswolds now work from Stow Police Station as Moreton has been closed and Bourton on the Water has been mothballed. Don't yet know if the Olympics will impact on work load or how Police Commissions will affect the Force. PC Gary Brewer's post secure till 2013 and PCSOs in the District are secure at the moment.
Sgt Jones requested early notice of Jubilee events.

The Old Prison Campaign – Cllr N Fletcher & Mrs Diana Ray

Mrs Ray advised Members:

- There is no news on Heritage lottery bid although it was due to be announced yesterday or today.
- Petition has been submitted to CDC with over 1200 signatures and another 35 have been received in the last few days. At least over 850 were qualifying.
- Mrs Ray has received no response or acknowledgement from CDC despite its policy stating that this should be done within 10 days. She had spoken to Nigel Adams at CDC and been told he was waiting to speak to Frank Wilson.
- She hoped that the issue would be included on the agenda for CDC's February meeting and that no sale decision will be taken on bids until after that despite the decision having been delegated to small group at their July meeting.
- Bid criteria has been requested but has still not been received. Deadline for bids is 31 January.
- Diana went on to describe the process that she had followed to obtain information from CDC.
- She asked for help with her presentation to CDC's meeting and stated that CDC had given no consideration to the economic impact on Northleach.
- Mrs Ray asked if the Council would lobby all District Councillors and also consider putting forward a request to CDC to put the sale of the building on hold for 12 months whilst the community puts together a bid for the property.
